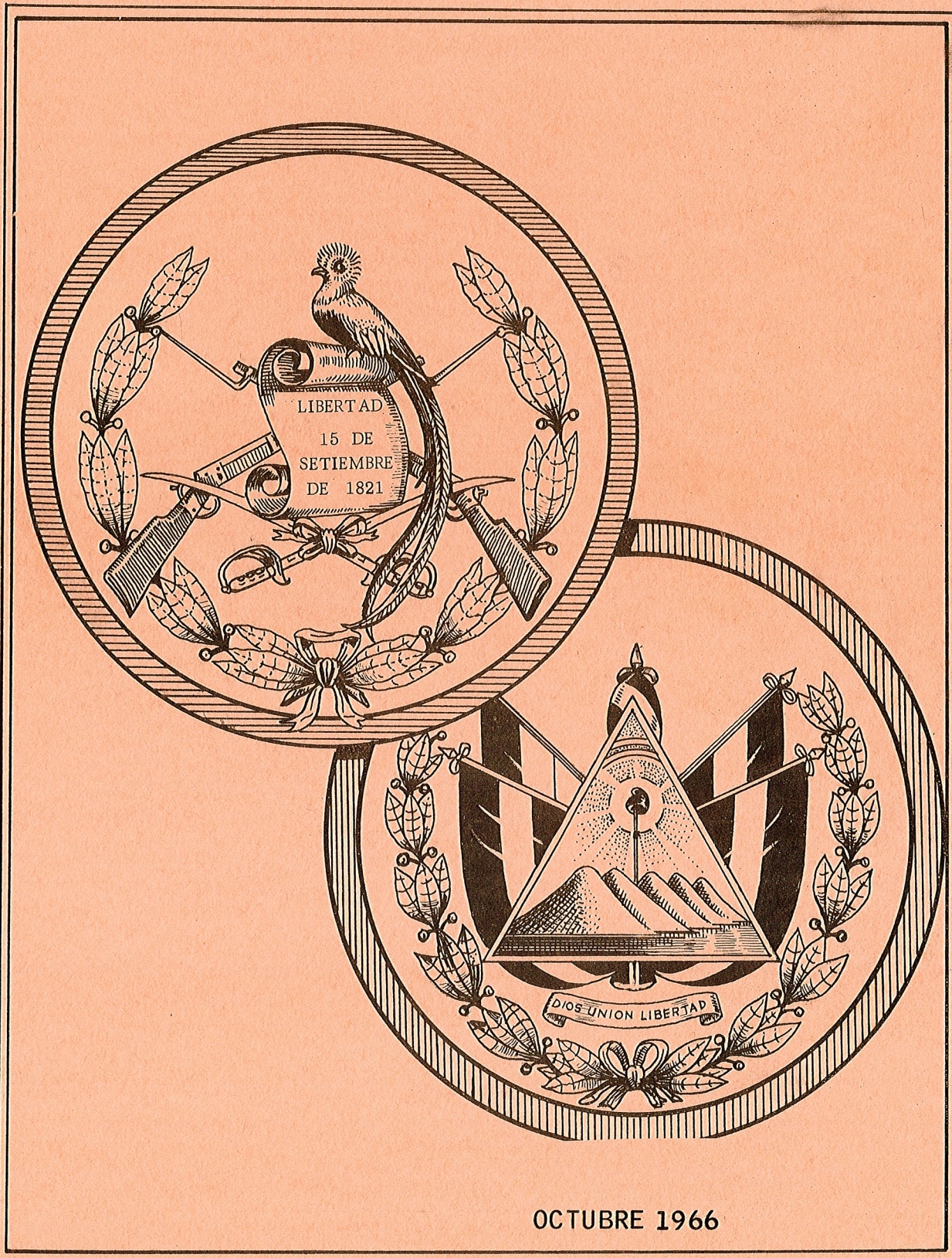

Dear Fellow MISSIONARIES:

Every MISSIONARY in this mission is here in answer to a call to serve the Lord and thereby help establish the Kingdom here in Guatemala and El Salvador. Every MISSIONARY has been set apart and has been given the necessary authority to act in that calling. Every MISSIONARY has, therefore, been charged with responsibility and is expected to be true and faithful.

A MISSIONARY is a unique, distinct kind of an individual, different from any other person. A MISSIONARY is a messenger of God, endowed with divine authority to do what no one else may do, that is, properly teach the gospel of Jesus Christ and bear testimony to its truthfulness to all of God's children.

One of our most serious problems in the mission field is that quite often MISSIONARIES seem to forget who they are, whom they represent, and to whom they are responsible. Some, at times, simply forget that they are MISSIONARIES. Or they rationalize that their's is the privilege of being a MISSIONARY part of the time and being a 19 or 20 year-old youngster the rest of the time. Conflicts with evil thoughts, sports cars, girl friends, boy friends, sometimes contribute to a cloudy mind and distorted vision and a lack of a true understanding of what MISSIONARY work really is. A single action contrary to long-established MISSIONARY standards oftentimes brings a judgment against every other MISSIONARY and even against the Church. And it takes months, often years, to right a wrong that is a consequence of poor judgment, immaturity, or lack of respect for others.

We often leave an appointment card with our investigators reminding them of our future visits. Perhaps it might be well to print our own "appointment card" and with big letters prepare a sign that says, "I AM A MISSIONARY." Many other important ideas might be added to remind us that the call is for two years, and that never during that two year period will there be a time when we will not be expected to act like MISSIONARIES.

MISSIONARIES who give dignity to their call and to themselves never play cards, they never play pool, they never go swimming, they never dance, nor do they seek the company of the opposite sex. Why? Because they are MISSIONARIES.

May every MISSIONARY be a worthy MISSIONARY.

400th MISSIONARY TO EL SALVADOR - Arriving at the airport "Ilopango" last September 15th in San Salvador, Elder Kenneth Jones from Magna, Utah, and Elder Bruce Lloyd from Provo completed the number of 400 missionaries that have arrived in that country during the Church's 10-year history there.

TABERNACLE CHOIR TELEVISED IN CENTRAL AMERICA - With a historic first program shown on Sunday, October 9th, the Mormon Tabernacle Choir performed to a potential television audience of several millions in Central America. Aired by Channel 4 in San Salvador, known to reach points as far away as Honduras and Nicaragua, the well-known "Music and the Spoken Word" program will be presented weekly at 5:30 p.m. through the courtesy of Mr. Roberto Imberton, Manager of Channel 4.

QUE SIGUE DEL BAUTISMO? - During the past month, the Church fellowship program has given vigor to those recently baptized. In Branch 4 of the El Salvador District 35 of the 47 newest members are 100% attenders.

TEXAS DOES IT AGAIN - Helping the branches in the country of El Salvador with membership and administration problems, Brother and Sister Mitchell's help has been keenly felt. Church records have been a recent problem and Brother Mitchell requests special care on the part of the elders in filling out baptismal papers correctly. Interesting note: The Mitchells, recent arrivals from Houston, subscribe to the doctrine: "Don't ever ask a man if he is a Texan. If he is, he will tell you. If he isn't, don't embarrass him!"

PACKED TRUNKS?? - With rather dazed looks, Elders Henstra, Lambson, and Erickson received notice of their October 19th release date. One of them was reported to have said, "On my bags? I've already air-mailed them home!" The El Salvador Zone will feel the loss of these fine missionaries. Also Elders Cameron, Bigler, Yost, and Sorenson will be leaving us next week.

POSSIBILITY FOR SCHOOLS - Guatemala was favored with a special visitor on October 10th. Dr. Keith R. Oakes, Assistant Administrator for the Church school system, came on a special visit to this mission to see about the possibilities for Church schools here. He indicated that we have the "go-ahead" for seminaries in the mission. He was very impressed with the progress that the Church has made here.

ANOTHER NEW CHAPEL IN GUATEMALA CITY - Two weeks ago the new chapel in Zone 1 of Guatemala City was finally finished and inaugurated for the use of Branches 1 and 3. It was under construction for 3 years and had an approximate cost of \$228,000. Missionary work in the city will be greatly benefited by this beautiful chapel.

The spirit of true reverence in our baptismal services will impress favorably Church members and non-member friends who may attend.

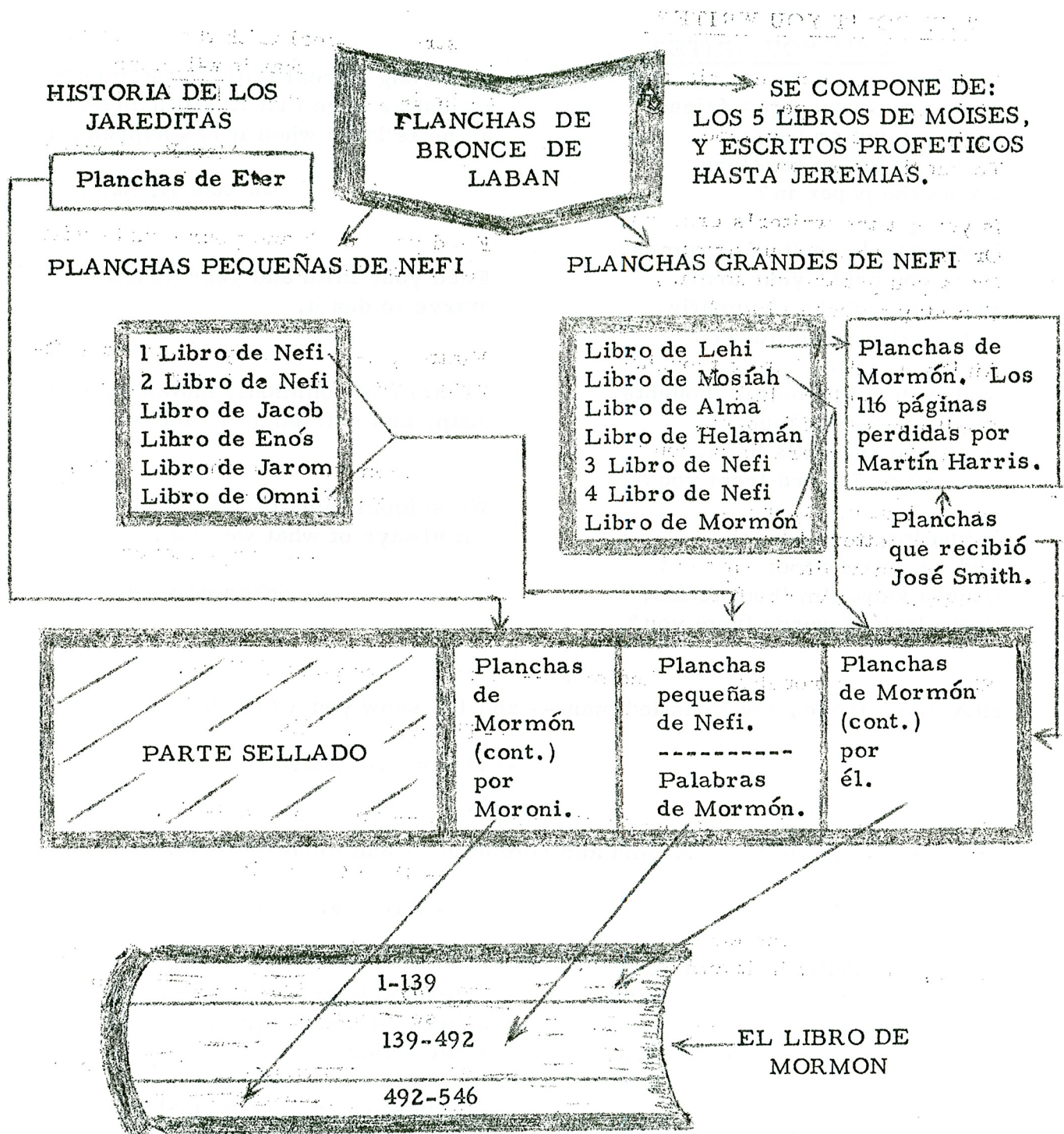
EL RETO DEL LIBRO DE MORMON

Hay que cumplir con las siguientes treinta condiciones para producir un registro similar bajo condiciones comparables:

1. Escriba una historia del Tíbet Antiguo, cubriendo un período desde el año 2200 A.C. hasta el año 400 D.C.
2. Incluya en la historia dos naciones distantes y separadas junto con las historias de diferentes naciones contemporáneas o grupos de gente.
3. Describa sus religiones, economías, culturas sociales, y políticas.
4. Teja en la historia la religión de Jesucristo y el modo de vivir de los Cristianos.
5. Usted tiene veintitrés años de edad.
6. Usted no ha tenido más que tres años de educación formal.
7. Empiece ahora y edite este registro, cubriendo un período de 2500 años de historia en 60 días.
8. Escriba no una corta sino una larga historia, de más de 500 páginas, y cada una conteniendo más de 150 palabras.
9. Tiene que terminar en sesenta días y no puede cambiar el texto, además de que la primera edición tiene que perpetuarse para siempre.
10. No puede decir algo absurdo ni imposible, ni contradictorio.
11. Tiene que reclamar que su narración no es ficticia sino verdadera; aún una historia sagrada.
12. Hay que invitar a los estudiantes y expertos más capaces para examinar el texto con cuidado, y tratar diligentemente de ver que su libro es proveído a los que están tratando de probar que es falso.
13. Tiene que escribir esta historia con la base de lo que AHORA sabe.
14. Publíquelo a toda nación, tribu, lengua y pueblo como la palabra de Dios.
15. Tiene que incluir dentro del registro mismo esta promesa tan maravillosa y a la vez peligrosa, "Y cuando recibáis estas cosas, quisiera exhortaros a que preguntáseis a Dios el Eterno Padre en el nombre de Cristo, si no son verdaderas estas cosas. Y si pedís con un corazón sincero, con verdadera intención, teniendo fe en Cristo, El os manifestará la verdad de ellas por el poder del Espíritu Santo."

16. Su registro tiene que cumplir las profecías bíblicas aún hasta la manera exacta.
17. No se sabe casi nada acerca de las culturas de estas civilizaciones al tiempo de hacer este registro.
18. Todos los datos, ideas y declaraciones presentados como la verdad en su historia tienen que estar casi directamente opuestas a la creencia del mundo. Muy pocos datos están aclarados y reconocidos acerca de esta civilización y sus 2600 años de historia.
19. Mediante investigación, evidencia científica, y descubrimientos arqueológicos durante los siguientes 125 años tiene que verificar sus detalles como la verdad.
20. Después de 125 años de análisis extensivo ningún dato es desaprobado, pero todo es vindicado. Todas las teorías o ideas en cuanto a su origen se caen dejando su reclamo como lo único posible.
21. No puede haber ningún defecto en el libro entero.
22. Evidencias internas y externas, y profecías tienen que confirmarse y cumplirse en los siguientes 125 años.
