

### Dear Fellow Missionaries:

These latter days are of transcendent significance in the world's religious history. During this time the fullness of the gospel has been restored and already many people have been taught and baptized into this, the true Church.

Modern revelation teaches us that many people will receive their blessings at the hand of Ephraim (DC 133). It is interesting and rather significant that Ephraim's brother, Manasseh, should have responded so well and so recently to the gospel message. Their father, Joseph, must now have a certain satisfaction that so many of his descendants are hearing and accepting the gospel.

The term "latter days" suggests an approaching end and we all live anticipating not so much the "end" of this period but the beginning of another era or the Millennium. Look around and consider the thousands of people who have not yet heard the gospel message here in Guatemala and El Salvador. The combined population is about 7,500,000 and we only have 17,000 members of the Church in these two countries.

Thus it would appear that there is a certain urgency about our delivering the message of the gospel to all of those who have not yet heard it. Webster defines urgent as: pressing, plying with importunity; calling for immediate attention; instantly important. And how better might we describe the need for our renewed and sustained diligence?

Sometimes we send telegrams as <u>URGENTE</u>. There is a small extra charge which is usually offset by the faster service. Oftentimes a telegram ends with: "<u>Urge mandárnoslo</u>," The verb <u>urgir</u> has immediate meaning for everyone and it may well serve as a daily reminder and give meaning to the following:

ESTOS SI SON LOS POSTREROS TIEMPOS Y URGE TRABAJAR CADA VEZ MAS DURO.

May the Lord bless all of us and instill within us a desire to magnify and dignify our call to serve as missionaries. Indeed, there is an urgency about our being true, effective ambassadors of Jesus Christ.



### THE GUATEMALA CITY STAKE



May 18-May 21 were eventful days in the history of this Mission in that the first stake in the Guatemala-El Salvador Mission and in fact, the first in Central America was organized.


The visiting General Authorities who came to organize the stake of Zion were Elder Marion G. Romney and President A. Theodore Tuttle.

During the days preceding May 21 Elder Romney and President Tuttle thoroughly interviewed several men until they found those whom the Lord had chosen to direct the Stake. The stake president is Udine Falabella; his first counselor is Enrique Rittscher; and his second counselor is Erwin Afre.

There were twenty-nine High Priests ordained, this includes the three men in the Stake Presidency, nine High Councilmen, and six Bishoprics to preside over the six wards.

Branches 7, 8, and 9 in the Capital City will remain under the direction of the Mission until they are stronger and can sustain themselves as wards.

Elder Romney said that there are three things that this Stake will not have as yet: a Seventies quorum; a Patriarch; and a full scale Welfare Program. These things will be added as the people are prepared to receive them.



### Z YZ HZALIHY

There have been so many illnesses of late that we feel it wise to remind you to evaluate your living conditions, your eating habits, and personal habits of cleanliness. It has been stated by a reliable physician that most of the diseases in the tropical areas can be avoided by being reasonably clean and careful. With all the provalent cases of parasites and amoebas it would appear that we are lacking considerably in our effort to avoid these diseases, and are becoming increasingly careless.

Are you being reasonably careful by observing the following personal habits?

Bathing daily with a soap containing hexaclorophene?

2. Always washing your hands before you ear, using a hand brush to clean under nails and loosen stubborn dirt?

3. Always washing your hands after using the bathroom?

Are you being reasonably careful by insisting on the following standards in the places where you live?

1. Use of only boiled water to cook and to drink (or bottled purified water).

2. Cleanliness of quarters and particularly that clean bathrooms be disinfected at least every other day if not daily,

The use of sprays and/or screens to keep insects and flies to a minimum.

Are you being reasonably careful in your eating habits by:

1. Never eating anything from street vendors.

2. Observing complete abstinence of cabbage, lettuce, raw celery, raw root vegetables, and strawberries.

Insisting that those who cook your food do not use shortening derived from pig fat, and that they wash all fruits and vegetables thoroughly with soap and water before preparing them.

May we remind you that your gamma-globulin shots are not a magic cure-all, nor a magic preventative which allows you to be more relaxed in observing the standards listed above. Your future health depends upon how you take care of yourself now. Your effectiveness in serving the Lord is greatly diminished when you are not feeling well, or when you must spend your missionary labor time in bed. It is not only disanimating to yourself and your companion, but a worry to your parents, to the Mission President and to the Missionary Committee.

Take care of yourself, we need you...healthy!

#### HELPFUL HINTS

#### Fellow Missionaries:

In my work as Membership Secretary Thave found several problems that could easily be eliminated by using the proper procedure.

1. Suppose that José Ernesto García Ramírez was baptized into the Church. His mother's name is, María del Carmen Ramírez, and his father's name is, Alfredo García Santos. When you fill out the Recommendation for Baptism and Confirmation please place parentheses around the name of the mother. Thus the name becomes:

José Ernesto García (Ramírez)

2. A note at the side of the names of the father and mother of the baptism, saying whether or not they are members and whether or not they are married is always needed and should be included. The baptism goes by his father's name which is true even if he prefers to go by his mother's name unless he is not recognized by his father. If he is not recognized by his father please make a note on the recommendation slip. He then uses him mother's name and should be written without including his father's name:

José Ernesto Ramírez

3. Each District Leader is responsible for filling out the 110-FP card to be sent in with each baptism. He should always double check to make sure he has made no mistakes. The most common mistake is putting the baptismal date where the the birth date should be. District Leaders are reminded that all baptisms must be turned in by the 5th of each month.

#### Elder Madsen

Following the counsel of our mission leaders, we all strive for the presence of the complete family during the presentation of a lesson; however, once we have the family assembled, how successful are we in holding the attention of all present? The children are just as important to our Heavenly Father as the parents and can answer simple questions if given the opportunity. Asking the children simple questions serves as an effective teaching method because in this way we will hold the attention of the younger members of the group because they will feel a part of the discussion and at the same time the point is stressed more vividly upon the minds of the parents.

For what purpose do we attend Sunday School and Sacrament meetings each Sunday? Is it to catch up on our Bible or Book of Mormon study, or to do the reading assignment for Monday's study class? CHURCH SERVICES ARE NOT PERSONAL STUDY PERIODS. We should be there to help our investigators and set an example for them as well as the members. We need to remember that the Latin people have just as much right to inspiration as we do and many times have spent many hours preparing a message which we could use to better our lives also. Therefore, let us not be rude. Fay attention!

That it is against Church policy for missionaries to help or to sponsor members or friends to go to the United States?


District Leaders: That you should fill out your monthly report forms for chattenge-like this:

Elders Fulano y Mengano 8 ----- indicates challenge for the coming month.


20 ----- indicates challenge for the previous month.
