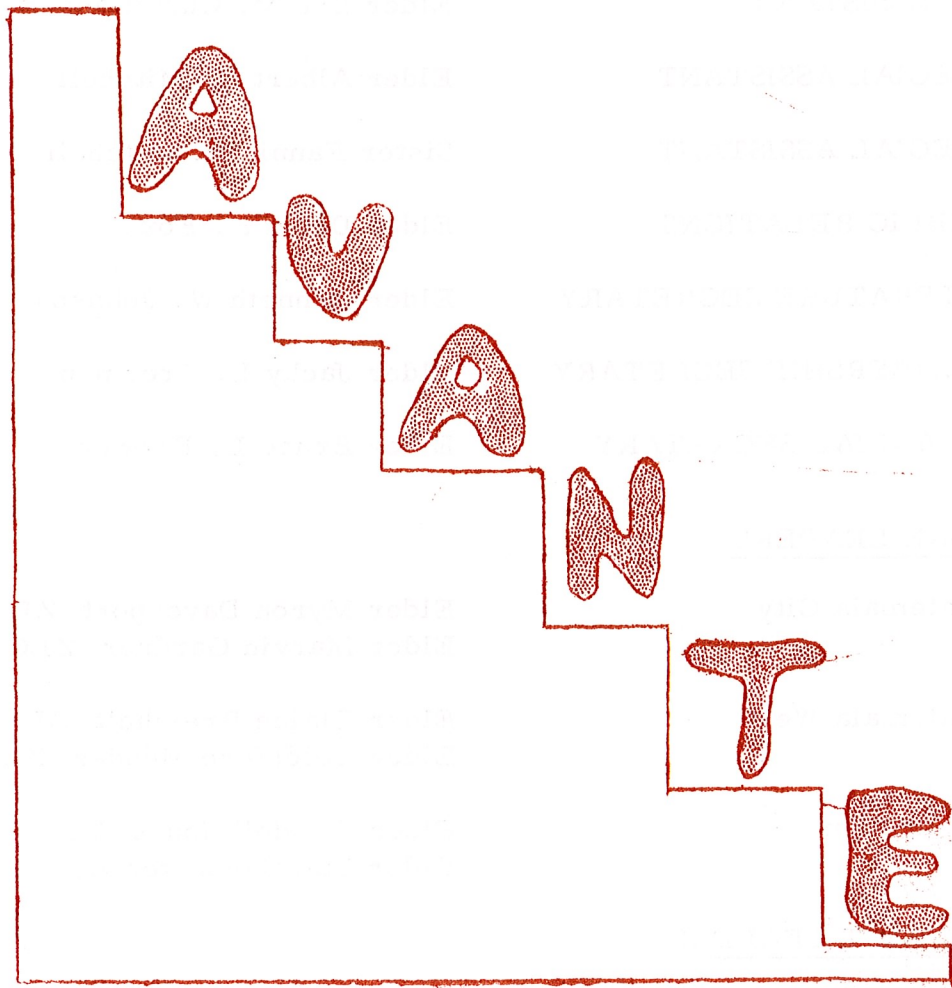

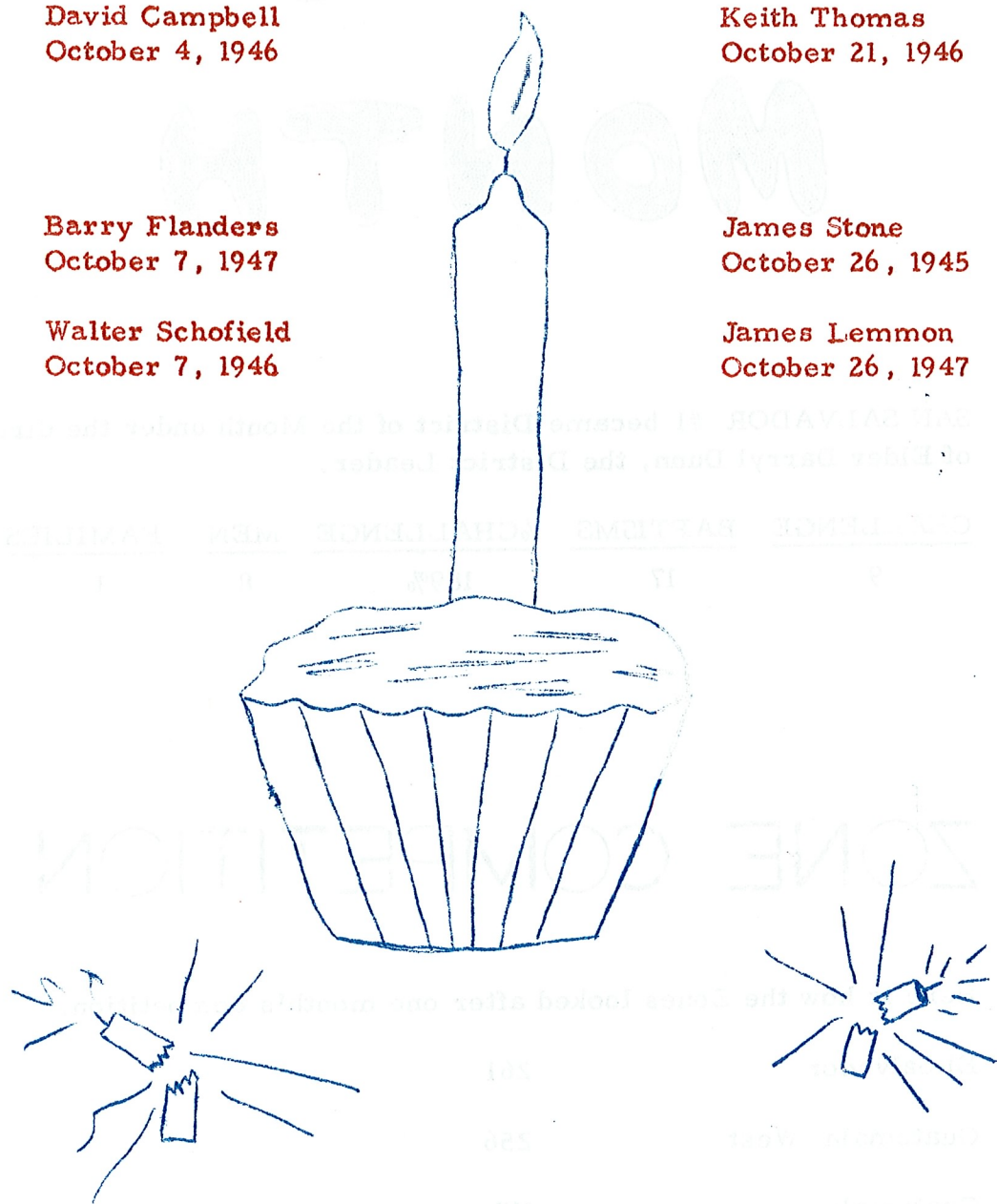

Tu and Vos

"Tu" and "Vos" are personal pronouns in the second person singular, applicable to either gender. The latter form was used anciently as a manner in which to say, for example, "Vos sois mi protector". Today, however it is used only in poetry and to address God or a person of high authority.

In colloquial Spanish "Tu" is sometimes replaced with "Vos", which is quite improper. In many countries this misusage does not exist anymore but among us it is still common.

"Tutear" is to address someone in the "Tu" form. This is customary among relatives and friends at all social levels. Not only should superiors be addressed in the "Usted" but those who are socially inferior with whom there is no friendly relation.

To use the "Tu" form with a superior where no friendship or confidential relation, is an abuse of which many are guilty and which the superior sometimes tolerates condescendingly. It is also improper to use the "Tu" form with one's peer or inferior, unless there exists a family tie or bond of friendship or trust. If it is abusive to use "Tu" with a superior, how much worse it is to use "Vos" and change the verbs, saying, "Mirá vos" instead of "Mira tú" or "Vos tenés" for "Tu tienes". This not only shows disrespect for the person addressed, but also is an offense to the Spanish language.

"Voseo" is used by many with superiors in an attempt to equal themselves with the superior addressed; this is an abuse of common courtesy. Occasionally, between a superior and an inferior there exists a trust of confidence which has developed over the years. A wise person will always use "Usted" with his superior, unless the superior initiates the use of the "Tu" form.

The fact that the majority of the people misuse these pronouns does not excuse us from making the same error. We should try to learn Spanish in its purest form and make practical use of it at all times with all types of people. Missionary work has many facets, and on more than one occasion one has the opportunity to work with people that use correct Spanish, and are proud of the fact. On such occasions the missionary has the opportunity to use his full knowledge of correct Spanish. The correct understanding and usage of Spanish is not limited to Elders in specific programs, but of each individual. Every Elder has the great responsibility to teach the gospel to the best of his ability, which will be quite impossible if he hasn't a means of communication which is ample and clear.

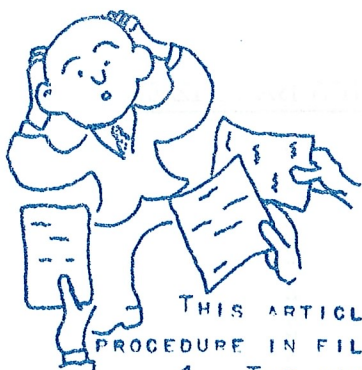

THIS ARTICLE IS TO HELP THE ELDERS TO UNDERSTAND THE PROPER PROCEDURE IN FILLING OUT THE RECOMMENDATION SLIPS FOR BAPTISMS.

1. THE NAME OF THE BRANCH SHOULD ALWAYS BE IN FULL. (EXAMPLE: GUATEMALA #7, SAN SALVADOR #5, ESCUINTLA, ETC.)

2. IF YOU BAPTIZE PEOPLE INTO THE STAKE, PLEASE STATE SO IN THE SPACE INDICATED MISSION.

3-4. THE LATIN PEOPLE ALWAYS TAKE THE NAMES OF BOTH PARENTS. THE FATHER'S NAME FIRST AND THEN THE MOTHER'S IN "PARENTHESIS". THE ONLY EXCEPTION IS WHEN THE FATHER IS NOT MARRIED (MEANING THAT HE IS NOT RECOGNIZED). IN THIS CASE THE PERSON HOLDS ONLY THE MOTHER'S NAME. IF THE FATHER IS NOT RECOGNIZED PLEASE DO NOT PUT HIS LAST NAME WITH THAT OF THE CHILDS (#3). WHEN A WOMAN GETS MARRIED SHE DROPS HER MOTHER'S NAME BUT RETAINS HER FATHER'S IN PARENTHESIS. SHE TAKES ON THE NAME OF HER HUSBAND WITH THE WORD "DE". WHEN THERE IS A CONTROVERSY ON WHETHER TO USE THE LEGAL OR PREFERRED NAME OF A PERSON, USE THE LEGAL NAME FOUND ON BIRTH CERTIFICATES AND CÉDULAS. (ATTACH THE PREFERRED NAME ON A SEPERATE SLIP OF PAPER.)

5. THEIR HOME ADDRESS SHOULD BE FILLED OUT IN FULL WITH THE STREET, NUMBER, ZONA OR COLONIA, CITY, AND COUNTRY.

6-7. BOTH PARENTS NAMES SHOULD BE SPECIFIED, EVEN THOUGH THE FATHER MAY NOT BE RECOGNIZED (MARRIED). AFTER THE PARENTS NAMES INDICATE WHETHER THEY ARE MEMBERS OR NOT. ALSO INDICATE IF THE BAPTISM IS A MALE OR FEMALE AT THE TOP OF THE SLIP.

8-9. THE CORRECT DATE AND PLACE OF BIRTH CLEARLY AND COMPLETELY. (NO ABBREVIATIONS). IF THE CORRECT DATE CANNOT BE LOCATED PUT AN APPROXIMATE DATE. WE MUST HAVE A BIRTH DATE!

10-11. THE DATE OF BAPTISM AND FULL NAME OF ELDERS TO BE CLEARLY INDICATED.

"NO DITTO MARKS PLEASE!"

12. AT THE EXTREME UPPER LEFT HAND CORNER OF THE REVERSE SIDE PUT THE NAMES OF THE ELDERS TO WHOM THE BAPTISM IS TO BE CREDITED.

13-14. THE NAME OF THE WIFE OR HUSBAND SHOULD BE WRITTEN AS IT WILL APPEAR ON THE MEMBERSHIP CARD. ALSO INDICATE WHETHER THEY ARE MEMBERS OF THE CHURCH OR NOT.

15. THE DATE OF THE MARRIAGE SHOULD BE FILLED IN ALONG WITH THE CITY IN WHICH THE MARRIAGE TOOK PLACE. THE NECESSARY INFORMATION SHOULD BE FILLED IN IF THEY HAVE DIED OR HAVE DIVORCED. IF THEY HAVE NOT BEEN MARRIED ADD AFTER THEIR NAME "NOT MARRIED".

IF THERE ARE MORE THAN TWO MARRIAGES OR RELATIONSHIPS WHICH INVOLVE THE BIRTH OF CHILDREN, A LIST OF ALL CHILDREN AND THEIR PARENTS SHOULD ACCOMPANY THE RECOMMENDATION SLIP.

16. THE NAMES OF ALL CHILDREN SHOULD BE WRITTEN IN THE PROPER SPACES PROVIDED. IF A CHILD HAS DIED AT BIRTH OR ANY TIME THEREAFTER, THE WORD "DIED" AND THE DATE OF DEATH SHOULD FOLLOW THE CHILD'S NAME.

ATTENTION!

TO ALL MISSION PRESIDENTS

RE: Army Reservists on Missions

Dear Brethren:

Numerous inquiries have come to the Missionary Department from parents, mission presidents and missionaries in response to a Department of the Army communication dated 22 September 1967, addressed to "Members of the U. S. Army Reserve Residing in Overseas Areas and Those Engaged in Religious Missionary Service."

The letter advises that such reservists must "participate satisfactorily in troop program units of the Reserve Components," or apply for discharge, with consequent liability for service under Selective Service regulations.

We have been working on this problem for sometime and are hopeful that a resolution of the problem now facing many of our missionaries will soon be made. Those who received the communication referred to above are given sixty days in which to exercise their option which should afford time to work out a solution to the problem. However, each reservist should acknowledge immediate receipt of the communication.

We shall advise you of any further developments. In the meantime will you please forward the above information to any reservists in your mission.
