DEAR MISSIONARIES:

PRESIDENT TUTTLE, DURING A RECENT MISSIONARY CONFERENCE HELD HERE IN GUATEMALA CITY, READ TO US FROM A SPEECH DELIVERED BY BROTHER BOYD K. PACKER TO THE BYU STUDENT BODY. THIS SPEECH HAD TO DO WITH THE THOUGHTS AND HOW TO CONTROL THEM. WE THINK IT WOULD BE APPROPRIATE TO MENTION A FEW OF THE MAIN IDEAS OF THESE REMARKS.

 - A. ALMA PERCEIVED THE THOUGHTS OF OTHERS.
 - B. NEPHI HAD THE GIFT OF DISCERNMENT.
- IV. YOU CAN ONLY THINK ONE THOUGHT AT A TIME.
 - A. WHEN THINKING A GOOD THOUGHT YOU CANNOT THINK A BAD ONE.
 - B. GOOD THOUGHTS HAVE TOP PRIORITY.
- V. THOUGHTS CAN BE INFLUENCED.
 - A. GOOD OR EVIL CAN INFLUENCE THOUGHTS.
 - B. BODY CAN INFLUENCE THOUGHTS.
- VI. WE HAVE FREEDOM TO CHOOSE OUR THOUGHTS.
 - A. WATER TO STAY ON COURSE NEEDS A CLEAR CHANNEL, SO WITH OUR **MINDS.**
 - B. TO CONTROL THOUGHTS, REPLACE BAD ONES WITH GOOD ONES.
 1. CHOOSE A FAVORITE HYMN AND MEMORIZE IT. USE IT AS AN EMERGING CHANNEL. SING IT WHEN YOU FEEL THE TEMPTATION TAKING CONTROL OF YOUR MIND.
 2. "...LET VIRTUE GARNISH THY THOUGHTS UNCEASINGLY; THEN SHALL THY CONFIDENCE WAX STRONG IN THE PRESENCE OF GOD; AND THE DOCTRINE OF THE PRIESTHOOD SHALL DISTIL UPON THY SOUL AS THE DEWS FROM HEAVEN."

POINTS FOR CHALLENGES

AS A RESULT OF THE RECENT MISSION LEADER'S CONFERENCE A REVISION HAS BEEN MADE IN THE POINTS RECEIVED FOR THE CHALLENGES. POINT VALUES WILL NOW BE AS FOLLOWS: ONE POINT WILL BE RECEIVED FOR THE FIRST FORTY CHALLENGES AND FORTY MUST BE GAINED TO RECEIVE THE INITIAL POINT. FROM THEN ON, 1/4 POINT WILL BE RECEIVED FOR EACH SUBSEQUENT 10 POINTS.

ARE YOU TAKING A PARROT HOME?

DUE TO A NEW BILL PASSED RECENTLY IN THE STATES, IT IS BECOMING INCREASINGLY MORE DIFFICULT TO BRING PARROTS AND THE LIKE INTO THE COUNTRY. GOING THROUGH MEXICO CITY?

THE 12 NOON PERFORMANCE OF THE BALLET FOLKLORICO IS BEST BET FOR GOOD SEATS.

ELDERS LEAVING IN GROUPS HEADING FOR THE SAME DESTINATION WILL DO WELL IN WEIGHING LUGGAGE IN AT THE AIRPORT AS A GROUP AS THE CHANCES ARE BETTER IN NOT HAVING TO PAY OVERWEIGHT CHARGES.

IF YOU ARE IN SALVADOR WHEN YOUR MISSION ENDS, MAKE SURE YOU CHECK INTO THE OFFICE EARLY THE DAY YOU GO HOME BECAUSE YOUR PASSPORTS ARE REQUIRED TO PICK UP YOUR PLANE TICKET. THIS IS FOR ANYBODY, WHETHER YOU ARE GOING THROUGH MEXICO OR NOT.

PUT YOUR SHOULDER TO THE BILL!

KING MIDAS SOUGHT IT, SOLOMON HAD IT, AND HERRERA SEEMS TO BE GETTING IT, THAT IS, MONEY.

INJURIES TO ELDERS ANNUALLY COST THIS MISSION A TREMENDOUS AMOUNT OF MONEY, A SUM FOR WHICH THE MISSION SHOULD NOT BE RESPONSIBLE. ALMOST EVERY ELDER BEFORE COMING ON HIS MISSION BOUGHT INSURANCE THAT INSURES HIM AGAINST ACCIDENT, INJURY, HOSPITALIZATION ETC. MOST PARENTS HAVE SEPARATE INSURANCE POLICIES THAT ALSO PROTECT THEIR MISSIONARY DURING HIS MISSION.

IT IS NOT VERY GOOD BUSINESS NOR SENSE TO PAY FOR SOMETHING THAT YOU DON'T HAVE TO PAY FOR, YET MANY MISSIONARIES PAY AS HIGH AS FORTY DOLLARS AND THE CHURCH MUCH MORE WHEN FOR A FEW MINUTES OF LETTER WRITING THE MISSIONARY COULD SAVE HIMSELF AND THE CHURCH MONEY AND PROBLEMS.

IF YOU FIND THE LANGUAGE IN THE POLICIES A LITTLE HARD TO UNDERSTAND BE RECONCILED IN THE FACT THAT THEY ARE DESIGNED SO THAT ANY SIMPLE-MINDED PERSON CAN UNDERSTAND THEM, THEREFORE YOUR COMPANION OR DISTRICT LEADER WILL BE OF GREAT HELP IN THE MATTER.
